CALL FOR PAPERS

Indian Armies

The British Commission for Military History's 2012 summer conference will take place at Keble College, Oxford, from 20th-22nd July 2012. Proposals (c.200 words) are invited from established scholars and doctoral researchers for papers of 20 minutes on subjects related to the history of Indian armies and warfare on the sub-continent and beyond. Themes which may be addressed include but are not limited to: the pre-imperial military history of India; the operations of Indian armies and sub-continental campaigns during the British imperial period; the nature of indigenous military forces and the experience of Indian soldiers at home and abroad; British military service and campaigns in India; Indian soldiers' service overseas, including in the two world wars; the sub-continent's post-independence armies and wars.
